

We were requested to perform a flyover and took two planes; the P-64 and the T-6, both manufactured during WWII by North American Aviation in Los Angeles, California.

Our time over target was 12:05 pm and we had to loiter in the area. But first, we had to find the cemetery. You'd think it would be easy but it took a little bit of reconnaissance. Finally, we picked out the school buses and flags.

We came back right on time and made four passes north and south.
